WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE OFFER

Central European University is a graduate level, Englishlanguage university founded in Budapest, Hungary, and it currently has moved to the recently founded Vienna campus but it maintains its presence also in Budapest.

Our department offers <u>TWO-YEAR MA</u> and <u>PHD PRO-GRAMS</u>, coordinated with the Bologna process requirements and accredited in Austria (that is, accepted throughout Europe) as well as in the US; and a <u>ONE-YEAR MA</u> accredited in the United States and Austria. Graduates of both MA programs have been admitted to the most prestigious PhD programs world-wide.

FUNDING


CEU offers full or partial tuition awards and various other types of <u>FINAN-CIAL SUPPORT</u> on a merit basis. Most MA students are also offered housing.



RESEARCH UNITS

The Department, together with the Department of History and other CEU units, hosts numerous research units, among them the Center for Eastern Mediterranean Studies, the Center for Religious Studies, the Jewish Studies Program, the Medieval Central Europe Research Network (MECERN), etc., and offers a number of <u>Specializations and Advanced Certificates</u> such as: the Advanced Certificate in Religious Studies (ACRS), Advanced Certificate in Eastern Mediterranean Studies (EMS), Jewish Studies Specialization (JSS), Advanced Certificate in Political Thought, and Cultural Heritage Specialization.

In addition, the Departments of Medieval Studies and History jointly run <u>Early Modern Studies</u>, a new platform for studying all aspects of the Early Modern period.



CULTURAL HERITAGE STUDIES PROGRAM

The <u>Cultural Heritage Studies</u> two-year MA program grew out of the Department of Medieval Studies, but it is not focused exclusively on the Middle Ages. The program expects applicants dealing with a variety of periods and from a variety of fields related to cultural heritage, such as history, art history and management, archaeology, ethnography, anthropology, architecture, landscape design, monument protection, environmental science, and management studies. It combines theoretical and practical education, with a strong emphasis on practical knowledge and skills based on fieldwork and internships. Graduates of the program will be capable of working at various levels in cultural heritage and resource research, protection, and management.



In order to make the work of students more effective, the <u>Source Language Teaching Group</u> offers Latin, Greek, Ottoman, Turkish, Arabic and Syriac courses and, on demand, Middle English, Hebrew, Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian, Armenian, Old Georgian, Russian, Old Church Slavonic and Persian courses as well.

OTHER EVENTS

Our department also participates in the international **ERASMUS EXCHANGE** program, which offers a 3-12 month long study abroad for PhD and MA students.
